The regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Greenville was held on May 12, 2004 at 7:30pm at the Pioneer hall. All Board members were present and there were 47 guests, including attorney Ted Hilscher.

Mr. Cardamone opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance.

After reading by the Clerk, Mr. Seeley moved, seconded by Mr. Nugent, to accept the minutes of April 14.

After audit, Mr. Nugent moved, seconded by Mr. Seeley, to pay bill 11 on Trust and Agency abstract #5 for \$12,220.87.

Carried 5 ayes

After audit, Mr. Nugent moved, seconded by Mr. Seeley, to pay bills 7-8 on Pioneer abstract #4 for \$223.67.

An zoning informational meeting will be held on June 2 at 7 pm at the Cultural Arts Center to address concerns of the Greenville area.

Mr. Lewis moved, seconded by Mr. Nugent, to accept the recommended negotiated tax settlements of Dunican properties.

A discussion was held concerning the policy of paying of bills at the start of the meeting. The consensus was to continue the existing policy.

The Assessor has determined to remove the residential percentage on granting senior tax exemptions. - attached.
